Energy in Canada @ 150 and Beyond

Greetings from the Energy Council of Canada.

One of the ways that the Energy Council is commemorating Canada's 150th anniversary is by gathering articles on Canada's energy future by Canada's energy leaders on topics of their choice.

I am very pleased to report that three new articles have just been posted on our website. Here are a few highlights.

Elyse Allan, President and CEO, GE Canada, has written on ***Disruptor or Disrupted: Canada's Role in the Changing Global Energy Market***. Her article describes the volatile, uncertain, complex, and ambiguous world in which we live, and how we can go about securing a place for Canadian energy resources within it.

Two articles contributed on behalf of energy industry associations complete the package. They focus on the role of renewables in end-use applications and on the continuing opportunities for hydropower.

Canada's Future is Electric has been contributed by the **Canadian Council on Renewable Electricity**, representing four industry associations involved in renewable energy. This article provides an overview of Canada's uniquely strong and still expanding position in renewable generation, and the foundation this provides for deeper electrification and decarbonization across the building, transportation, and industrial sectors.

Third, an article from the **Canadian Hydropower Association** entitled ***Hydropower: Storied Past, Brilliant Future*** outlines how hydropower has delivered major environmental benefits to date, and has helped Canada create one of the world's cleanest electricity grids. With unmatched dispatchability, hydropower provides Canada with a key strategic advantage.

I hope that you enjoy reading these interesting and thought-provoking articles.
